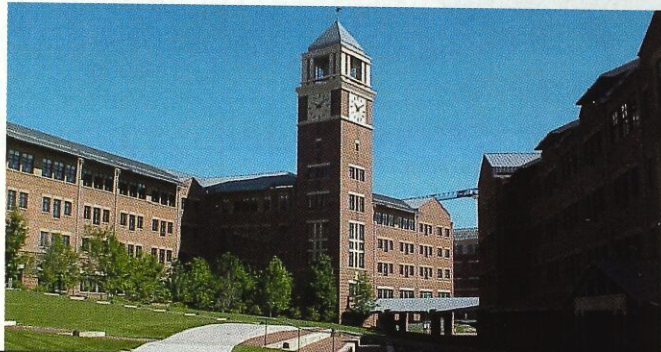

**STG: Sprint World HQ**

Security Technologies Group, Inc. (Rank: 4), is involved in an ongoing project for Sprint. "We've worked with Sprint for about 12 years now," says Adam Stanislaus, director of business development, STG. When Sprint decided to build their own facility, they put it out for bid, which STG won. To date, about 12 buildings have been completed out of 21. When complete in the fall of 2002, the campus will house about 15,000 people, plus restaurants, dry cleaners, a drug store, fitness center and flower shop. The project involved CCTV, access control, badging, fiber optic networking, Code Blue devices, optical turnstiles — "just about every technology available in the security today," Stanislaus says. The installation included a video wall, a world command center that manages about 60 percent of all Sprint facilities with access control in them, and a complete network. "We have our own server farm in there. To us, it's not unusual, but to many it may be," Stanislaus says. "To me this is just typical security in the high-end market." Total project revenue: \$15 million.

*The Sprint World Headquarters, located in Overland Park, Kan., will house 15,000 people, and includes restaurants, drycleaners, a fitness center, and a security command center that manages about 60 percent of all Sprint facilities.*
