Top Security Firms Push \$3 Billion Level

SDM's sixth annual ranking of the largest electronic security firms is based on 1995 gross revenues, which reached \$3 billion last year.

he only thing constant is change, goes the old adage. Nothing could more accurately describe the 1996 SDM 100, a ranking, by 1995 gross revenues, of the largest electronic security alarm installing and monitoring firms in the United States.

Widespread consolidation in the security industry last year is part of the reason that there are 17 new firms listed on the 1996 SDM 100. According to data supplied by each firm, the SDM 100 collectively purchased 180 alarm companies in 1995, resulting in a gain of more than 600,000 alarm subscribers (see SDM 100 Stat Sheet on facing page). This is a conservative estimate, as some firms didn't report their acquisitions. However, it still is a significant gain over 1994, when SDM 100 firms reported acquiring 107 companies and 131,000

The other part of the reason for the 17 new SDM 100 companies is a decision by SDM's editors to shift some firms that primarily install access control, closed-circuit television, and integrated systems from the SDM 100 and place them on a new list of top systems integrators (look for it in a future SDM). Filling the void created by the shift of systems integrators are firms new to the SDM 100 or firms new to our industry. These include Republic Industries (No. 11), Centennial Security Holdings (No. 23), Protection Service Industries (No. 33), Central Control Alarm Corp. (No. 30), and

The result is a "new" SDM 100 comprised of firms that bear a similar profile: their primary business is selling, installing, servicing, and monitoring burglar and/or fire alarm systems. For virtually all of these firms, access control, CCTV, medical alert, home automation, and other types of equipment is secondary.

Still, the firms are diverse. Their revenues range from \$814 million at the top (ADT Security Systems) to \$2.8 million for No. 100 (Doyle

The fine-print has changed, too. Participating firms were asked to help verify their stated revenue by submitting appropriate documentation to SDM. The following symbols are used:

A v appearing in the 1995 revenue column means 1995 revenue has been verified with proper documentation.

A v appearing in the 1995 rank column means 1994 revenue has been verified with proper documentation.

A vu appearing in either column means although documentation was submitted for 1994 or 1995, it wasn't audited or reviewed by an independent party, as was requested.

The content has changed, as well. Although all of the firms listed on the SDM 100 are basically electronic security installation companies, in past years the list also included firms that predominately install integrated systems and/or extensive access control and closed-circuit television systems. Those firms will now appear on a separate list of top systems integrators in SDM's June issue.

The SDM 100 generated nearly a fourth of the security industry's total revenue, which was \$12.9 billion in 1995.

SDM 100 revenues in 1995 amounted to approximately \$3 billion, representing 23 percent of total industry revenues. However, because about 85 percent of the firms are privately held and some didn't release information about accounts, recurring revenue, or installations, care should be exercised in using this information to extrapolate industry norms.

Security Systems). The 100 firms fall into three major groups: there are six firms that operate nationally, about two dozen that operate in one or more regions or statewide, and the remainder that can be described as local operations. In fact, 48 companies have one to three office locations.

For the first time, SDM 100 firms were asked to supply documentation that verified their gross revenues; about 30 percent of the firms cooperated. If documentation wasn't available to verify 1995 revenue, then it was furnished for 1994 revenue, and this is noted in the tables. (For more detailed about how to read the tables, see box at left.)

The presentation format of the SDM 100 also has been improved. Information about each firm is presented in a tabular format instead of the former square boxes that were published in previous years. This allows you to read and compare the data more easily.

As in the past, there are three ways to compare SDM 100 companies: by gross revenue, as listed in the main table on the following pages; by total installation volume, as presented in the table on page 76; and by annual recurring revenue, as shown in the table on page 78.

New in 1996 are tables that list the top 10 fastest-growing companies by gross revenue (page 80), by recurring revenue (page 78), and by installation volume (page 76). These are based on two- and three-year averages and include only those firms that have participated in the SDM 100 for that length of time.
