

Consolidation Rebuilds the Top

Revenue growth through acquisition continues to shape the industry, while indicators point to a rebuilding of infrastructure to accomodate the fast-paced growth, in this 9th annual ranking of security's top firms.

The game among SDM 100 firms in 1998 was consolidation and growth—with a twist. A greater number of firms reported downturned revenues compared with 1997.

SDM 100 firms reported acquiring at least 1.19 million subscribers, helping to surge their total annual recurring revenue to \$2.76 billion (a 23 percent increase over 1997). Yet the group's numbers also show that 20 percent of firms did not grow their total gross revenues last year. While the total number of new residential installations in 1998 rose 22 percent, much of that growth is attributed to a handful of firms with impressive numbers of new installs, as well as several firms that reported installation figures for the first time, making a year-to-year measurement of growth more difficult.

A curious fact—the count of full-time employees at SDM 100 firms grew only 2 percent last year.

Indicators and comments from these security dealers also point to a rebuilding of infrastructure for many firms, after a several-year period of rapid growth through acquisitions.

This year there are 21 firms listed for the first time on the SDM 100. Three of them rank in the top 16. Notably missing is The Westec Security Group, which sold its residential division to Edison International last August, but still remains in the security industry, operating Westec Interactive Security Inc. and Westec Business Security. It is hoped that this firm will rank in the 2000 SDM 100.

There are three ways to compare and contrast the SDM 100 companies: by gross revenue, as presented in the main table on the

How to Use the SDM 100

The 1999 SDM 100 ranks, by 1998 gross revenue, firms that provide electronic security systems and services to both residential and nonresidential markets. This ranking is based on information either provided to or estimated by SDM. Ranked companies were asked to submit either an audited or reviewed financial statement, or a copy of their income tax return showing total gross receipts for the stated period. A vast majority of the firms ranked are privately held.

The main table, which begins on page 54, ranks 100 firms by their 1998 total gross revenue. The largest firm is ranked as No. 1, and so on.

For each of the 100 companies, the

following information is provided (from left to right):

* 1999 rank (in red print), which is based on total 1998 gross revenues.

* 1998 rank (in black print). Note: If the firm was not previously ranked, then no number appears in this column.

* Company name as used in the marketplace (in most cases) and headquarters city and state.

* Total gross revenue in millions of dollars. This number represents total U.S. revenue in calendar- or fiscal-year 1998 from security system sales/installation, service, leasing, and monitoring. An e following the revenue indicates it is an SDM estimate.

* Percentage of growth or descent from 1997 to 1998 total gross revenue, where applicable.

* Number of subscribers, or customers, each firm counted at year-end 1998. This number reflects contracts that are owned by the SDM 100 firms; it does not include additional subscribers that the firm may monitor, but not own.

* Number of new system installations in 1998. The letter R represents residential systems and the letter C represents non-residential, or commercial.

* Number of full-time employees.

* Number of business locations, including both headquarters and branch offices.


This table presents the aggregrate totals for the 1999 SDM 100. In a \$15.23 billion industry in 1998, these firms captured \$3.77 billion and count more than 7 million customers. It's important to note that most electronic security companies—even among the top 100—are privately held, and therefore, aren't required to release financial information. Most firms—but not all—reported recurring revenue, accounts, and installation volume. Therefore, you should exercise caution when using this information to extrapolate industry totals or to benchmark.

For a firm to qualify for ranking on the SDM 100, it must be an installation company. It also must sell and install electronic security systems. It may also provide service and monitoring; however, firms that provide only service or monitoring do not qualify. **SDM**

Twenty percent of SDM 100 firms experienced a downward revenue shift in 1998 (compared with 10 percent in 1997). The average revenue decline in 1998 was 6.35 percent. However, 78 percent of firms grew revenue. The average revenue increase was 23.3 percent. More than one in three firms with revenue increases also reported making acquisitions last year.



Total gross revenue in 1998 from SDM 100 firms reached \$3.77 billion, a 13 percent increase over 1997. Much of the increase is attributed to growth in monthly recurring revenue, which surged 32 percent. Account acquisitions played a major role, with at least 1.2 million contracts changing hands in 1998.







The table above re-ranks SDM 100 companies by both residential (left column) and non-residential (right column) installation volume. The top 50 in each sector are ranked.



Total residential system installations among the SDM 100 in 1998 were 22 percent higher than in 1997, reaching more than 900,000 systems. Several factors were involved: substantial increases for Protection One, Protect America, and SLP Ventures, among others; several previously ranked firms that for the first time reported installations to SDM; and a nearly 2-to-1 ratio of firms reporting new-installation gains versus those reporting declines in 1998. In the non-residential sector, a substantial decrease in new installations can be largely attributed to non-reporting by ADT.
