At times last year it must have felt like running against the wind, but despite the challenges, the SDM 100 finished strong — adding subscribers, gaining RMR, and hiring staff.

eaders of the 2002 SDM 100 will have two questions: 1) Have the top firms shifted since last year? and 2) How did the SDM 100 perform in 2001?

First, the top 25 have shifted dramatically, for two reasons. One is that the SDM editorial staff broadened the qualification criteria for ranking. The chief criterion for ranking on the SDM 100 has been that the firm is in the electronic security installation business. Over the past several years, dealer programs — firms that purchase subscriber contracts from independent dealers that do the selling and installing, then monitor those accounts — have grown in number and size. They receive revenue directly from the consumer market, and therefore, are considered "security providers." Therefore, we felt it appropriate to invite dealer-program firms to participate in the SDM 100.

The second factor is the absence of three firms from among the top 20 in the 2001 SDM 100:

Edison Security, Smith Alarm Systems, and Cambridge Security Systems — all were purchased by ADT Security Services (Tyco Int'l) in 2001.

#### PERFORMANCE

In 2001 the SDM 100 firms performed fairly well. Total SDM 100 revenue increased nearly 10 percent to \$4.58 billion. Major shifts among the top half of the list (both substantial gains and losses) made it initially difficult to measure overall performance of the SDM 100. (For example, ADT, the No. 1 firm, marked a 25 percent increase to \$2.5 billion in 2001.) Additionally, the SDM 100 suffered the losses of at least five large, previously ranked firms, which were purchased. However, that alone doesn't tell the whole story.

A more comprehensive way to view performance is to look at SDM 100 firms individually. Among firms with which two years of revenue could be compared, 81 percent experienced a rev-

enue increase, and 19 percent declined. The average gain was 12 percent, down slightly from 2000.

Some executives described 2001 as a "tough year," citing Sept. 11 as having a major impact on sales – at first negative, but then turning positive in certain markets.

Among firms for which two years of recurring monthly revenue (RMR) data were available, 95 percent recorded increases in RMR. This seems to account for most of the overall gains, because installation revenue was weak. Among firms for which two years of installation revenue could be compared: in the residential sector, 47 percent of firms advanced, 49 percent declined, and 4 percent stayed even. In the non-residential sector, 55 percent advanced, 44 percent declined, and 1 percent were even. For many firms, gains in the residential market seemed to result in losses in non-residential, and vice versa. Apparently 2001 was a year in which executives focused their energies into one or the other market.

SDM 100 firms reported that nearly 65,000 subscriber accounts changed hands in 2001, and they acquired at least 50 firms (excludes ADT acquisitions, which were not officially reported to SDM).

#### WHAT THE SDM 100 MEASURES

The 2002 SDM 100 ranks U.S. companies that provide electronic security systems and services to both residential and non-residential customers. This ranking is based on information either provided to or estimated by SDM. Ranked companies were asked to submit either an audited or reviewed financial statement, or a copy of their income tax return showing total gross receipts for the stated period.

The main table, which begins on page 40, ranks 100 firms by their 2001 total gross revenue. The firm with the highest revenue is ranked as No. 1, and so on. For each of the 100 companies, the following information is provided:

- Current year rank, which is based on total 2001 gross revenues. (Note: If two firms have identical revenues, before rounding, then the number of subscribers is the second determining factor for ranking.)
- Previous year rank. If the firm was not previously ranked, then no number appears in this column.
- Company name and headquarters location.
- Total gross revenue in millions of dollars. This number represents total revenue in calendar- or fiscal-year 2001 from security system sales/installation, service, leasing, and monitoring. An e indicates it is an SDM estimate.
- Percentage of growth or descent from 2000 to 2001.
- Amount of recurring monthly revenue (RMR) as reported to or estimated by SDM,recorded on Dec. 31, 2001.
- Number of subscribers at year-end 2001.
- Number of system installations in 2001, residential.
- Number of system installations in 2001, non-residential.
- Number of full-time employees.
- Number of business locations.

Group Power presents aggregate figures for the SDM 100 group of companies. In a \$19.2 billion industry, these top 100 firms captured nearly \$4.6 billion in revenue and counted at least 8.35 million subscribers in 2001. Most of the SDM 100 firms are privately held. Submitting total revenue is required for ranking, but providing additional data is not required. Most firms – but not all – also reported recurring monthly revenue, subscriber accounts, and installation volume. Therefore, one should exercise caution in using this information to extrapolate industry totals or to benchmark.


#### SALES REVENUE BY PRODUCT CATEGORY

Examining sales revenue-only shows that much less comes from traditional security systems (burglar alarms) than in past years. For example, in 1995, burglar alarms comprised 65 percent of total sales revenue, and in 2001 it comprised just 49 percent. Growth categories are integrated residential and integrated commercial systems. To identify companies that are strong in the residential or commercial markets, check the installation volume columns in the main table.

The largest 100 U.S. electronic security firms reported annual revenue of \$4.58 billion in 2001. This represents 24 percent of industry dollars. (Total industry revenue in 2001 was \$19.2 billion.) SDM 100 2001 revenue is back to just above the 1999 level, after a dip in 2000 - the result of an acquisition not counted in 2000 totals. While much of the gain in 2001 is attributable to a 25 percent increase for the No. 1 firm, ADT Security Services (which acquired Edison Security, Smith Alarm Systems, and Cambridge Security Systems), 81 percent of firms showed gains.




## SUBSCRIBER COUNT SPIKES AFTER PRIOR-YEAR DROP

The number of subscribers, or recurring revenue customers, of SDM 100 firms climbed back up, following a dip in 2000. (The dip was caused by a major sell-off — SecurityLink from Ameritech — which wasn't recorded in SDM 100 totals to its full extent due to the timing of the acquisition and this report.) Of note this year is ADT Security Services' reporting of 4.6 million subscribers, up from 3 million in the prior year. Among firms for which two years of subscriber numbers could be compared, 87 percent grew their subscriber bases, and 13 percent netted a loss.

Eighty-one percent of firms (those for which two years of data were available) recorded revenue gains in 2001 - the same number as in 2000. However, SDM 100 executives reported that it was tougher to achieve those gains: the average gain in 2001 was 12 percent, compared with 15 percent in 2000. One strong indicator of performance is that the number of full-time employees grew 23 percent, due to increases by ADT and many others.
